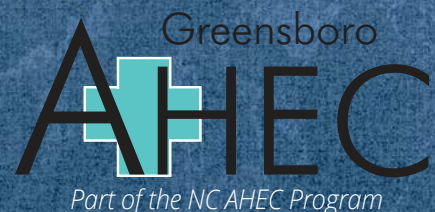

Program Goals:

The purpose of this program is two-fold: 1) provide updates regarding major advances and findings in the treatment of disease and standards of care and 2) provide models for practice effectiveness and efficiency that ensures adherence to government regulations and positive outcomes for patients. Beginning July 1, 2017, every physician who prescribes controlled substances shall complete at least three hours of CME that is designed specifically to address controlled substances prescribing practices. We are offering an optional three-hour session on controlled substance prescribing practices that meets the North Carolina Medical Board's requirement for Controlled Substance Prescribing CME.

Target Audience:

Physicians, physician assistants, nurses, government, community health advocates, community program leaders committed to a health enhancement agenda and administrative and legislative policy makers.

Learning Objectives:

- Discuss the best practices for prescribing controlled substances.
- Identify strategies to eliminate racial disparities in early-stage lung cancer treatment.
- Describe strategies for recognizing signs of abuse and misuse of prescription opioids.
- Discuss the utilization of the NC Controlled Substances Reporting System.
- Discuss best practices for managing chronic pain.
- Identify opportunities to expand access to healthcare.
- Explain the urgency to have African American physicians as leaders in medicine.
- Discuss the mental health disparities in healthcare.
- Review the latest innovations in stroke treatment.
- Recognize the disparities in cardiovascular disease in African Americans.
- Discuss the escalating value of African American physicians in the midst of race and racism in medicine.
- Recognize the alarming rise in infant mortality and maternal mortality.
- Discuss trauma and the societal effects.
- Explain the benefits and impact of the transition to Medicaid Managed care.
- Discuss how social determinants contribute to inequities in healthcare
- Discuss recent healthcare legislation in North Carolina.
